YOUR RIGHTS IN SCHOOL AND IN THE COMMUNITY

The following is a brief explanation of your rights based on laws and court decisions that affect public school students, as well as all individuals in the community. If you think your legal rights have been violated, you may consult an attorney. In specific cases involving your constitutional rights, advice and aid are available from the New York Civil Liberties Union, Nassau Chapter and other legal and community agencies listed in this directory (see Part I under Advocacy and/or Legal). For any problems regarding your educational rights, call the Long Island Advocacy Center at (516) 248-2222 in Nassau County and (516) 234-0467 in Suffolk County.

I. RULES OF THE SCHOOL

You have the right to know in advance all the rules which apply to you as a student. Unless rules are published, a punishment for a violation might be illegal.

II. DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEX

You have a right to attend any course and club activity in school regardless of your sex. If there are no girls' interscholastic teams, girls may compete with boys on existing teams provided a review panel finds the students physically fit to participate. If there are no boys' interscholastic teams in a sport, boys may join a girls' team as long as they do not displace any girls who want to try out for the team.

III. DISTRIBUTION OF LITERATURE, LEAFLETS AND NEWSPAPERS

You have a right to distribute leaflets, newspapers and other literature next to and on school property and in the school as long as it does not interfere with the rights of others. School officials may require that students give them material before distribution only when:

- a. the distribution of material is large, and
- b. school rules clearly describe procedures for submitting the material, and
- c. there is a limited, brief period for school officials to respond.

Approval may be denied only if school officials can specify how the distribution will interfere with normal school activities and if the material is obscene or libelous.

IV. BUTTONS AND ARMBANDS

As a First Amendment right, you may wear or display buttons, armbands, flags or decals, unless displaying them materially and substantially interferes with the orderly process of the school or the rights of others.

V. FLAG SALUTE AND THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

If you choose not to participate in the flag salute and the Pledge of Allegiance, you have the right to leave the room quietly or to sit or stand silently during these ceremonies.

VI. FREEDOM OF SPEECH

Students have the right to speak, write and meet freely with other students in clubs, organizations, rallies and demonstrations. However, school officials may limit your speech by prohibiting the use of vulgar or obscene language in school activities.

VII. FREEDOM OF PRESS

Students, not school officials, shall determine the content of school-financed publications. Student editors are limited only by their responsibility to refrain from libel and obscenity and from "material and substantial" interference with order and discipline in the school.

VIII. CENSORSHIP

School officials may not remove materials from the school library because they disagree with the ideas they contain.

IX. PRAYER

School officials may not set aside time in the school schedule for either spoken or silent prayer or mediation, though nothing prevents a student from praying silently.

X. DRESS AND GROOMING

Neither school officials nor the student government may discipline you in any way for your clothing or personal appearance unless they can show either that:

- a. it interferes with classes or school activities, or
- b. it presents a danger to health and safety (such as long hair in cooking classes or cleats on a gym floor).

XI. DRUG TESTING

Students interested in interscholastic sports may be required to submit to random drug testing by urinalysis with parental written permission.

XII. SCHOOL RECORDS

Your parents or guardians have a right to inspect your full school record, which cannot be made available to anyone without their consent, except for school authorities or the courts. At age eighteen, you have the right to examine your full school record.

XIII. ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

In New York, you have a right to attend school in the district where you live until you are 21, unless you graduate first. You must attend school until the last day of the school year in which you turn 16. Below the age of 16, home teaching or special classes must be provided for anyone excluded from school.

XIV. MARRIED OR PREGNANT

Students who are married or pregnant can attend school.

XV. ABSENCE-TRUANCY (ATTENDANCE POLICY)

Students cannot be suspended for truancy (unexcused absence), but school officials may and usually do establish a policy that requires specified minimum attendance to obtain course credit.

XVI. SUSPENSIONS

A suspension is a serious matter. Any temporary interruption of the right to attend any class is a suspension. You may be suspended for up to five days by a principal if you are insubordinate or disorderly. A principal may not delegate his authority to anyone else. Before suspension, you are entitled to be presented with specific charges and to tell your side of the story. Moreover, you or your parents may ask for an informal conference with the principal; and your parents have the right to question the complaining person. If you are suspended by the superintendent or the board of education for more than five days, you have the right to a hearing and to be represented by an attorney who may question witnesses against you. Any decision may be appealed to the N.Y. State Commissioner of Education and to the Courts. Any student under the age of 16 who is suspended for any length of time must be provided with alternate education during the suspension period.

XVII. DISCIPLINE - STUDENT WITH DISABILITIES SUSPENSION

If you are a student with a disability or perceived to be disabled, you will be subject to different procedures if your misconduct is related to your actual or perceived disability. Suspension for more than ten days (or a series of suspensions adding to more than ten days) requires a referral to a Committee on Special Education or a court order to be obtained by the school district.

XVIII. DISCIPLINARY TRANSFER

If the school wants to change your program or transfer you to another school for disciplinary reasons, you are entitled to a hearing before the superintendent.

XIX. STATEMENTS TO POLICE OFFICERS, TEACHERS AND PRINCIPALS

Police officials have no power to interview you in school without your consent; but they may ask your name, address, age and whether or not you are a student in the school. As a matter of courtesy, you should provide them with this information. You have the right not to answer any questions even if the school authorities advise you to do so or even if the police say you will not be allowed to leave until you have answered them. You do have the right to contact your parents and an attorney. Teachers and principals may question you only in regard to a possible violation of school rules, and any statements you make can be used against you. However, you have the right not to answer the question and to remain silent.

XX. AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Students may be required to remain after school as punishment provided they have appropriate transportation home. Students may also be excluded from recess, field trips and athletic teams for either disciplinary reasons or for failure to meet reasonable academic requirements. A student excluded from such activities has a right (together with his or her parents) to discuss such exclusion with appropriate school officials.

XXI. PRIVACY: SEARCH OF LOCKERS

School officials or the police, when asked by school officials, may search your locker and its contents and seize any materials illegally possessed which may be used as evidence against you.

XXII. OTHER SEARCHES

Police officers cannot search you except in one of the following circumstances:

- a. they have a search warrant, or
- b. you consent to be searched, or
- c. you have been arrested.

A search can include extensive examination of your clothing, body, handbag or packages and an automobile, if involved.

XXIII. STOP AND FRISK

If police officers stop you in a public place, they may frisk you for a dangerous weapon only if they have reasonable grounds to believe themselves in danger. A frisk is a pat down on the outside of one's clothing.

XXIV. AUTOMOBILE SEARCHES

Police officers may stop your automobile and examine your registration and driver's license and check the outside of the car for possible violations of safety requirements (tires, lights, windshield wipers, etc.). They do not have the right to search your car unless they arrest you or you agree to a search. A traffic summons is not an arrest. You may refuse permission to search your car, but DO NOT physically resist an officer who ignores your "No" answer and proceeds to search your car. Physical resistance, even to an officer's illegal act, is a crime.

XXV. CORPORAL PUNISHMENT

Corporal punishment in schools is prohibited in New York State.

XXVI. RIGHT TO SUE

A school administrator or a school board member may be sued for knowingly violating a student's constitutional rights.

XXVII. LOITERING AND WALKING

You have the right to travel anywhere in this country without identifying papers. Standing on a street corner, talking to your friends is lawful. Loitering for certain specific purposes, such as using dangerous drugs, is unlawful. Loitering in or about specific places, such as a school, without a legitimate reason is unlawful.

XXVIII. ARRESTS

You may not be arrested by a police officer unless the officer suspects you are about to commit or have just committed a crime.

XXIX. RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT

Other than the courtesy of giving your name, age and address to a police officer, you have an absolute right to remain silent when asked any other questions. You have an absolute right to an attorney before speaking. Anything you say can be used in court. Police are not obliged to give you advice as to your legal rights unless they intend to use your statement against you in court.

XXX. YOUTHFUL OFFENDER

Anyone up to 18 years of age who has been charged with a crime in adult court is entitled to an attorney and may be eligible for youthful offender treatment. Such proceedings can be held in private, and the decision to grant such treatment can be made only by a criminal court judge. If you are convicted but given youthful offender status, your finding of guilt is not considered a criminal conviction. Your record will be sealed and available only on court order. If youthful offender status is not granted, you will be sentenced as if you were an adult.

XXXI. JUVENILE OFFENDER

Anyone 14 or 15 years of age accused of a violent crime, such as murder, rape, assault, robbery, arson, burglary or kidnapping may be referred to criminal court. A 13-year old accused of murder will also be referred to criminal court. A decision by the District Attorney in consultation with the judge will be made as to whether the individual will be retained in criminal court as an adult case or referred to Family Court as a juvenile case.

XXXII. FAMILY COURT

- a. Juvenile Delinquent - Anyone between 7 and 16 years accused of an act which, if committed by an adult, would be a crime, will be referred to Family Court; e.g., for shoplifting, auto theft, trespassing, forgery, etc.
- b. Person in Need of Supervision (PINS) - Anyone under 16 years can be referred to Family Court if she/he is truant or is continually beyond the control of parent or other lawful authority. Typical complaints on a PINS Petition include running away, keeping late hours, sexually promiscuous behavior, etc.
- c. Family Court Procedures - The Family Court provides legal and social services. Privacy is a hallmark of its proceedings and records; and while a parent or guardian must be present, no member of the public or press can attend without permission from the judge. If the charges against an individual are proven beyond a reasonable doubt, the judge may decide either to discharge the juvenile, specify a course of treatment, place him/her on probation or in a residential home or state training institution. (See "WHAT HAPPENS IN FAMILY COURT".)

XXXIII. PROCEDURES AT THE TIME OF ARREST

1. Tell the police only your name, age and address. A police officer's promise to help you if you confess is not binding. Remain silent unless your attorney advises otherwise.
2. Do not resist arrest. Resisting arrest, even an unlawful one, is a crime.
3. You have the right to use the telephone to contact your family or an attorney. On minor charges, you may be released on no or low bail.
4. You will be brought before a judge within 24 hours after being taken into custody.
5. If you cannot afford an attorney, the court will appoint one for you without cost.

XXXIV. BIRTH CONTROL

Students have the right to information, counseling and contraceptives as part of their constitutionally protected right of personal privacy.

XXXV. SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual harassment is unwelcome sexual advances ranging from sexual insults, name-calling, off-color jokes, through intimidation by words or actions, offensive touching, talking, pinching, patting or grabbing, to pressure for sexual activity, assault and rape. Sexual harassment can occur student to student, staff to student, or staff to staff.

XXXVI. EMANCIPATED MINORS

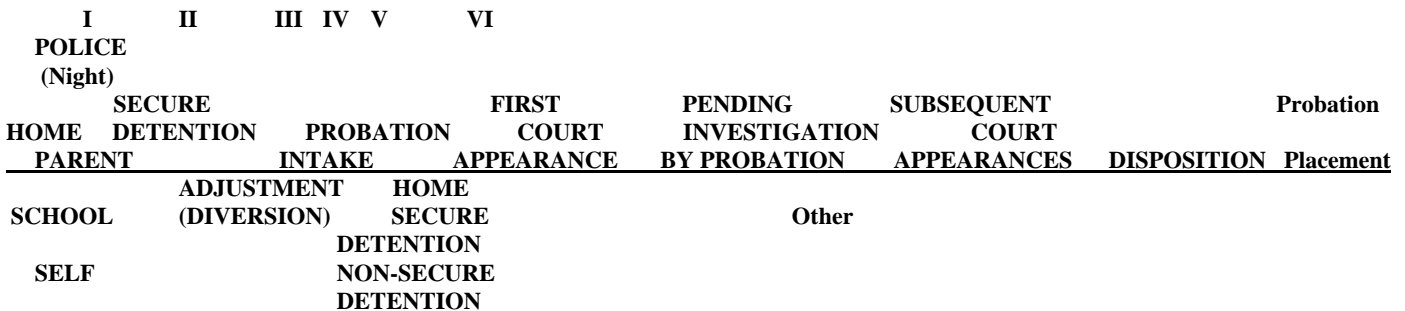
Students who are beyond the compulsory school age, live separate and apart from their parents in a manner inconsistent with parental custody and control, do not receive any financial support from their parents and have no intention of returning home may establish their own residence as emancipated minors. As a resident, the emancipated minor has the right to attend school without the payment of tuition.

WHAT HAPPENS IN FAMILY COURT?

The Family Court is the court which, in New York State, has the power (jurisdiction) to hear cases concerning young persons who break the law or who are in need of supervision, neglected, abused or handicapped. It also has support, paternity, custody, adoption and family offense cases. It is a civil court (not a criminal court). One of its primary functions, however, is to provide supervision, treatment or confinement for youngsters who have broken the law or who are out of parental control - **JD's & PINS**. (See "**YOUR RIGHTS IN SCHOOL AND IN THE COMMUNITY**," **XXXI. FAMILY COURT**.) The Family Court is complicated and can be confusing. If you are seeking help for yourself or come to Court as the result of someone (petitioner) bringing charges against you, the following advice can be helpful:

1. Be clear as to what will be happening. Do not be afraid to ask questions of your probation officer, attorneys or law guardian. (A law guardian is a lawyer assigned to represent you by the Court if you cannot afford to pay for the services of an attorney.)
 2. Be in touch with your probation officer, attorneys or law guardian whenever a problem arises or for any questions you may have at any time. Some of the agencies listed under **ADVOCACY** and **LEGAL SERVICES, PART I** in this Directory can also help you.
 3. It is also important to be aware that even though there are legal safeguards protecting the confidentiality of all Family Court proceedings, a record is maintained and could be used in the future if you again become involved with the juvenile (Family Court) or criminal justice systems.
- Below is a flow-chart showing how you become involved in Family Court. Immediately following the flowchart is an explanation of each of these steps:



I

Referrals are received from four sources: 1. the police (JD's); 2. parents (PINS); 3. schools (truancy - this is considered a PINS charge); 4. self-referral - anyone who feels he has a problem that can best be dealt with by the Family Court can walk into the Intake Section on the first floor of the Family Court building, 1200 Old Country Road, Westbury, N.Y., or call 571-9300 and discuss the problem. A small number of juveniles are detained in either secure detention at the Nassau County Children's Shelter or non-secure detention in group or foster homes. When Court is in session, the Judge who hears the petition can remand the juvenile to secure or non-secure detention or release him/her to the parent pending further court action. Detention decisions are in part based on whether:

- a. the juvenile will run away and not appear for return to Court, or
- b. the juvenile is a danger to himself or the community.

On evenings and weekends when the Court is not in session, the police determine whether or not the juvenile requires some form of detention. Only Juvenile Delinquents can be placed in secure detention; PINS may only be placed in non-secure detention, if needed. *See Step II, Flowchart.

II

At intake, a probation officer will help you and the petitioner decide whether your case needs to go to Court. If both the probation officer and petitioner are satisfied that you can get the treatment you need from an agency outside the Court or help from the probation officer, a Court referral is not made. This is known as an adjustment. If Court action is decided upon, the probation officer will prepare the necessary papers. Your parent or guardian must be present during the intake process and all subsequent Family Court proceedings. Volunteers maintain a Day Nursery free of charge between the hours of 9AM and 1PM on the first floor of the Family Court Building. This service is for children (up to age 16) of families conducting business at Family Court.

III

If your case is not adjusted at Intake, a petition is filed; and you are given a date to appear before a Family Court Judge (preliminary hearing). The charges are read. You will be asked if you have an attorney or a law guardian. You must have legal representation. Based on information provided by your attorney, the Judge will plan additional hearings. You and your parent or guardian must appear for this hearing. The Judge can remand you to the Detention Center or a non-secure facility during the first Court appearance, if returning home is inadvisable at this time. (See Paragraph I.)

IV

If the Court needs more information, the Investigation Unit of the Probation Department will do a complete report and make recommendations to the Judge. Your attorney or parent can also make recommendations.

V

The Judge reviews the probation material and anything else furnished by your attorney. Sometimes, the Judge will ask for additional reports to be prepared.

VI

At the dispositional hearing, the Judge has a choice of the following dispositions: Dismissal (all charges against you will be dropped); Adjourment in Contemplation of Dismissal (this is called ACOD and means you must stay out of trouble for the specified time); Probation, with certain requirements; Placement - in a foster or residential facility.

BE SURE YOUR ATTORNEY EXPLAINS ALL OF THE DETAILS OF THE DISPOSITION TO YOU. A VIOLATION OF A DISPOSITION COULD BRING YOU BACK INTO COURT.

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT FACT SHEET

DEFINITION: A child is considered to be abused or neglected under New York State Law if the child is less than 18 years old, and a parent or other person legally responsible for the child's care harms the child, creates substantial risk or harm or fails to exercise a minimum degree of care to protect the child.

EXAMPLES: **Abuse** - Fractures; burns; bruises; unexplained suspicious injuries; sexual assault; incest; placing a child in danger of serious injury.

Neglect - Inadequate supply of food, clothing, shelter and medical care although financially able; periods of no supervision; lack of emotional care; excessive corporal punishment and abandonment.

EXTENT: Child maltreatment crosses all ethnic, social and economic lines. Those responsible may be a parent, guardian, relative or friend. Anyone has the capacity to strike out in anger, pain or frustration or to mistreat a child due to stress, depression or lack of support.

CAUSES: Immaturity and unrealistic expectations, unmet emotional needs, stresses of child care, lack of "parenting" knowledge, economic crisis, social isolation, parent was a maltreated child, drugs or alcohol problems and attitudes toward violence.

EFFECTS: **Immediate** - Serious physical, mental or emotional injury or even death.

Future - Emotional problems, physical handicaps, antisocial behavior or crime.

WHAT YOU

CAN DO: Call the NYS Hotline at **1-800-342-3720** if you suspect someone you know is being abused. If you know a family in stress, ask a community agency to help.

You can help a friend. One of the best ways to help someone with a problem is to listen. Let your friend know you want to listen. It's not your job to solve your friend's problems. But you can help them figure out who to tell and how to tell it. You can offer to go with them or to help them practice what they want to say. If you have a problem or you have a friend who has a problem with abuse, speak to your parents, your teacher, your counselor or an adult you trust. You can call the Hotline 1-800-342-3720 (24 hrs./day, 7 days/wk.) or contact a community agency.

WHO MUST REPORT SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE? Under the law, certain professionals are required to report suspected child abuse. Some of these professionals are medical (doctors, nurses, hospital personnel); school personnel (teachers, counselors, administrators); mental health professionals (social service workers, psychologists); child and day care personnel; police officers.

These **mandated reporters** are required to report to the State Central Register; **Mandated Reporters Hotline - 1-800-635-1522. All Mandated Reporters should use this number.**

CHILDREN AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FACT SHEET

Society has only recently come to recognize the devastating impact that domestic violence has on children who are not, themselves, targets of abuse but who, instead, witness abusive behavior between their parents.

Definition: Domestic violence is about one person using violence and/or the threat of violence as tactics to gain and maintain control over another person. It is about a pattern that alternates between caring behaviors that reinforce the relationship and violent behaviors that attempt to intimidate the victim into meeting the abuser's needs.

Examples: Violent behaviors may take the form of physically abusive or frightening actions or may involve emotional abuse, such as threats or harm to pets or valuables. It may include forced sexual activity and create an environment of isolation and financial control. Most patterns are very complex, and the abuser uses many techniques to get his or her way.

Extent: Studies indicate that at least 3.3 million children between the ages of 3 and 17 are at risk of exposure to parental violence in the United States each year. The exposure of children may range from a fleeting glance to witnessing the murder of a parent. The adults involved tend to minimize or deny the presence of children during incidents, but interviews with children prove that they are usually exposed to what is happening. There is often a significant overlap between wife beating and child battering. This causes double trauma.

Causes: Most abusers target only specific individuals for their violence. Because they are able to control their behavior when confronted by other people or when dealing with the stress caused by them, it is believed by many that they have learned to use abusive behavior in specific situations and often feel falsely justified in doing so.

Effects: At best, children witnessing domestic violence carry emotional scars which make it difficult for them to establish meaningful, trusting, fulfilling relationships. At worst, they, themselves, become injury or homicide victims. Research has found that children are traumatized in these situations and learn roles that put them at risk for violence in their adult lives. They share a heritage of behaviors and lasting emotional pain remarkably similar to children of wartime atrocities. New evidence indicates that even a single traumatic incident can lead to serious problems evidencing themselves as emotional problems with diminished academic and interpersonal functioning.

Action: Society must have zero tolerance for abuse. The person with the ability to do harm must be held responsible if they do harm. If your schools or youth programs are not offering information to children on violence in dating relationships, request it. If you know of an adult who is being abused or suspect that it is happening, tell them they can get help and remind them that they are not the only victims in the family. HOW DO I HELP A CHILD IF I THINK THEY ARE WITNESSING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

If you know a youth or child who might be witnessing abuse, there are important messages to convey. What is happening is not your fault, and you probably can't control it. There are ways to keep yourself safe. You have choices not to repeat or tolerate violent behavior in your own life. There is help. Call an adult who you trust. You don't have to handle this problem alone.
